

The elementary school essay asked whether a school principal should be permitted to send a child home who was wearing a t-shirt that said "I hate President Bush." Students could also submit a work of visual art in an art contest, portraying government in action.

Winning essays were read and art was displayed by the students in a ceremony on April 29, 2005, in courtroom #1, attended by student families, teachers, school administrators, Lycoming County Judges, and members of the legal community.
