Thomas Jefferson wrote "...were it up to me to decide whether we had a government without newspapers or newspapers without a government, I should not hesitate a moment to prefer the latter." Explain why you agree or disagree.

Art Contest (All Grades)

Art projects include posters, dioramas, videos, poems, creative writings, photography, songs etc.

Art submissions should not be any larger than 4 feet by 4 feet.

Video or song submissions may not exceed five minutes.
