MEMORIAL SERVICE

PRESIDENT JUDGE BUTTS: Good afternoon. This afternoon we have the privilege of holding a memorial service for a 63-year member of our Bar Association, Paul Wertman, who passed away on July 23rd of this year. Unfortunately, it appears that we don't have any family members that are here for this memorial service, but I would like to recognize everyone here to share in their thoughts and memories of Mr. Wertman.

The Court appointed a Committee to prepare a Report and Resolution recognizing the life and accomplishments of Mr. Wertman and the members of the Committee who are here are Scott A. Williams, the Chair; Retired Judge Kieser; and Ed Mitchell. Howard Langdon was part of the Committee and, I believe, shared some thoughts with Mr. Mitchell that he will share as part of this proceeding. So I will, without further ado, direct the matters over to Mr. Williams.

ATTORNEY SCOTT A. WILLIAMS: Thank you, Your Honor.

PRESIDENT JUDGE BUTTS: You're welcome.

ATTORNEY SCOTT A. WILLIAMS: I'll use this. I need something to hold myself up. Anyway. This is a Report of the Committee of which I've been asked to chair and we're going to be making motions, resolutions.

To the Honorable Judges of this Court. By Order of August 1, 2025, the Honorable Nancy L. Butts, President

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1 Judge of the 29th Judicial District of the Commonwealth of
2 Pennsylvania appointed the undersigned Committee to prepare a
3 Report and Resolutions memorializing the life of Paul "Will"
4 Wertman, Esquire. The Committee, as the Court has pointed out
5 who we are, for submission to the Court at a public ceremony to
6 be held today.

7 Accordingly, your Committee submits the
8 following Report and Resolutions.

9 Paul "Will" Wertman, a proud lifelong member
10 of the Eastern Lycoming County, Montgomery/Muncy area passed away
11 peacefully on Wednesday, July 23rd of this year.

12 Will was born on September 18th, 1934, in
13 Muncy, Pennsylvania, the son of William and Charlotte Wertman.

14 Will graduated from Muncy High School in 1952
15 and Penn State University 1956 and Dickinson Law School in 1959.

16 Will served in the Army National Guard from
17 1959 through 1962.

18 Will married Lois Wertman, maybe you remember
19 she was a clerk downstairs in the Recorder's Office, on
20 November 17, 1962, and shared 57 years of marriage until her
21 passing in 2019.

22 Will practiced law as a solo practitioner in
23 Muncy for 40 years specializing in wills, estate law, and real
24 estate. Will was particularly proud of the work he did with
25 seniors through the loss of a spouse and challenging legal

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1 challenges that those persons experienced.

2 Will was an active member of the St. Andrew's
3 Lutheran Church of Muncy and for the last five years attended Mt.
4 Pisgah Wesley Church in East Smithfield, Pennsylvania. He
5 especially enjoyed singing hymns and fellowship with fellow
6 Christians.

7 Will was community minded, volunteering for
8 many years, including a life-long membership of the Muncy Lions
9 Club. Will was in charge of the Montgomery -- the Montgomery
10 Lions Club not Muncy -- Montgomery Lions Club Easter egg hunt for
11 many years, sold gallons of sauerkraut and earned the high mark
12 of the Melvin Jones Fellowship Award, which is the highest form
13 of recognition that Lions Club International offers.

14 He was a member of the West Branch Hall of
15 Fame Committee and was honored as a Volunteer of the Year Award
16 in 2014.

17 Will served on the boards of the Lutheran
18 Evangelistic Movement East, Muncy High School Sports Hall of Fame
19 and Montgomery School Board and various other church councils.

20 Will was also a member of the Williamsport
21 Scottish Rite. Sports were a large part of Will's life. His
22 competitive spirit was reflected when he competed, coached, and
23 cheered his favorite teams. Baseball was his first love whether
24 he was watching the Yankees with his father, coaching Little
25 League and men's softball and supporting the Crosscutters. He

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1 could frequently be seen on the sidelines of local sporting
2 events.

3 Will was a lifelong ticket holder for Penn
4 State wrestling and was a dedicated fan of wrestling for 70 years
5 having followed the team all over the country to matches and
6 tournaments.

7 Will was a winsome and friendly person. I
8 can attest to that. He had high qualities of friendship and love
9 for his family and friends.

10 Will took time to foster relationships, which
11 allowed him to make new friends throughout life as well as
12 enjoying lifelong friendships.

13 Will cherished the moments with daily coffee
14 at the news stand, monthly luncheons, and friends of the Class of
15 '52 as well as with lawyers and friends.

16 His greatest joy was moments with his family,
17 especially his grandchildren. He took time to have one-on-one
18 relationships as Grandpa and Lois as Grandma, both of whom were
19 there to show their love and support of their grandchildren.

20 In addition to his parents and wife, Will was
21 pre-deceased by his brother, Max, in infancy and his cousin
22 Marlin and VanDorn Wertman, Jr., who were like brothers to him.

23 Will is survived by two children, two sons,
24 William Wertman of Boulevard and Thomas Wertman of Muncy, two
25 daughters and a son-in-law Valerie and Fred Simpson and Vickie

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1 and Gary Ward, all of Troy and eight grandchildren, Leah Ward,
2 Emma Simpson, Trevor Ward, Connor Simpson, Braden Ward, Lou
3 Wertman, Jackson Simpson and Lydia Ward.

4 Now, therefore, it is resolved by the
5 undersigned Committee members joined by the Bench and Bar of
6 Lycoming County do recognize and mourn the passing of Paul "Will"
7 Wertman and submit the following resolutions:

8 Be it resolved that as a result of the
9 passing of Will -- Paul "Will" Wertman, the Bar of Lycoming
10 County lost a respective, conscientious, honest, energetic, and
11 valued participant and his family has lost a devoted, kind, and
12 loving father and grandfather; and

13 Be it further resolved that the Court and the
14 Bar do hereby extend to Will's children and grandchildren our
15 deep and heartfelt sympathy and concern; and

16 Be it further resolved that these Resolutions
17 be spread at length on the minutes of the Court of Common Pleas
18 of Lycoming County, that copies be provided to the family of Paul
19 "Will" Wertman.

20 Respectfully submitted, Scott Williams.

21 I did want to make a few comment about Willie
22 as we called him. We had for a long period of time Charlie
23 Szybist, myself, and Mr. Mussina and other friends of Paul would
24 meet at the Holiday Inn for lunch on Fridays and we talked about
25 sports, we talked about our families and, of course, we had to

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1 hear about all the wrestling and why any man would want to go in
2 the middle of wintertime up to State College and around the
3 country in ice and snow, but he did. He was very much involved
4 in and you'd start talking about sports and he's going to talk
5 the rest of the lunch hour, but he was a very fine man.

6 I also was his neighbor for a number of years
7 in Muncy. A lot of times I would stop by his house on my bike
8 and saw him, it's only a block and a half away, so I'd knock on
9 the door and we would sit down for an hour or so and chat. We
10 talked about sports, we talked about our common faith in the
11 Lord, and they were a great couple. They were very down to earth
12 and they were happy about small things. I'll give you an
13 example. I live, as many of you know, I live in Laporte. Now,
14 in Laporte we don't have a lot of exciting things going on there.
15 Something that we have exciting is watching grass grow and
16 watching somebody's hair get cut. So one day Lois and Paul
17 noticed that there was a large tanker coming up 220 so it was a
18 big pipe or something, I don't know what it was, so they called
19 Lois' sister in Laporte and didn't half the town go and watch
20 them come up the big hill into Laporte on 220 and he got a big
21 kick out of that one.

22 So he was a great man and loved his family so
23 I was so happy to be the Chairman of the Committee. Thank you.

24 Now, I believe Ed has something and I'm sure
25 the Judge will follow.

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1 **PRESIDENT JUDGE BUTTS:** Mr. Williams, could we get
2 the Resolution from you?

3 **ATTORNEY SCOTT A. WILLIAMS:** Oh, sure.

4 **PRESIDENT JUDGE BUTTS:** Thank you. Mr. Mitchell.

5 **ATTORNEY EDWARD MITCHELL:** May it please the
6 Court, fellow members of the bar. I'll first read a message from
7 Howard Langdon, who also starts out may it please the Court,
8 Honorable Judges, Members of the Bar, Wertman family members and
9 friends. I apologize for appearing by letter, but I am on a
10 long-planned trip to Canada.

11 I first met Paul Wertman in 1975 when I
12 appeared in his office in the Muncy Masonic Building to apply for
13 a job as an associate attorney. He informed me that his desire
14 was to remain as a single, sole practitioner, however, we had a
15 long discussion about the practice of law in Lycoming County. In
16 his opinion the Muncy/Hughesville area would welcome another
17 attorney and would provide an excellent opportunity. He also
18 volunteered to provide me with advice upon my request.

19 I soon learned that his close friends called
20 him Willie, but for over 50 years I continued to call him Paul.
21 He was always open to a friendly conversation. Even before his
22 wife worked in the office of the Register and Recorder I had
23 become friends with Lois. In the practice of law almost all my
24 contacts with Paul concerned real property and estate
25 administration.

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1 Please grant me several minutes to inform you
2 of one real estate transaction that may be a chapter in my future
3 book. Paul represented an estate that was selling a house in
4 Muncy to my clients, the buyers. A realtor was not involved.
5 Paul and I negotiated an agreement of sale. My clients requested
6 permission to move into the house prior to closing while their
7 financing was pending. Paul agreed if the 5,000-dollar down
8 payment was non-refundable. The buyers agreed. The final
9 settlement was to be within 30 days. Two weeks after they moved
10 into the house, my clients appeared in my office, husband, wife,
11 and a teenage daughter. They were requesting the return of their
12 down payment and the termination of the agreement of sale. I
13 asked them why. The wife and daughter told me the house was
14 haunted. There were ghosts. I asked them for additional
15 information and I was informed that every night they smelled
16 fresh cut roses in the bedrooms. The daughter at night heard
17 chattering false teeth. I told them the judges of Lycoming
18 County would not accept their explanation as a violation of the
19 agreement of sale. I asked the husband for his position. He
20 said, quote, Langdon, I have not witnessed any paranormal
21 activity and I'm here only to save my marriage. I asked for
22 additional reasons that I could share with opposing counsel.
23 There were none. The wife and daughter refused to sleep in the
24 house. I informed the family that Paul Wertman was a reasonable
25 person, but I could not persuade him to terminate the transaction

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1 and return the down payment based upon the reasons given. My
2 clients decided that even if they lost \$5,000 they would not
3 purchase the house. I informed them that I would contact
4 Attorney Wertman, but I did not think that the down payment would
5 be returned. I consider myself a good lawyer, but the claim of
6 ghosts would not be successful. I called Paul and told him my
7 clients were requesting the return of the \$5,000 and the
8 cancellation of the transaction. My clients were in the process
9 of moving out. Paul was polite and friendly, but made it clear
10 that I had not persuaded him with any legal reason for the
11 reversal of the purchase. I acknowledged that I had a very steep
12 incline to climb to have any success. In my mind I could hear
13 either Judge Greevy or Judge Raup laughing at the request.
14 Therefore, I explained to Paul that once the community learned
15 that the house was haunted, his client would never be able to
16 sell the property, that the best avenue to resolve the matter was
17 to grant the buyers their request. After several minutes of
18 silent thought Paul granted my request if my clients would leave
19 the house without ever mentioning the ghosts. The down payment
20 held in escrow by Paul was returned. The rest of the story the
21 new and different buyers completed the purchase and moved in.
22 They never complained of ghosts, the smell of roses, or
23 chattering of teeth.

24 Paul Wertman was a gentleman and a very
25 active member of his church and community. I will miss him

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1 stopping by my office on a regular basis to sell raffle tickets
2 or sauerkraut for the Montgomery Lions. His visits resulted in
3 conversations concerning local issues.

4 Thank you. J. Howard Langdon.

5 Briefly on behalf of myself, I think these
6 two paragraphs that Scott put in the Resolution and which were
7 not from the obituary, this is Scott's work, say it all. Will
8 was a winsome and friendly person and had quality friendship and
9 love for his family and friends. Will took time to foster
10 relationships, which allowed him to make new friends throughout
11 life as well as enjoying lifelong friendships. That is in my
12 relationship with Paul Wertman that says it all.

13 I don't think that I ever had a legal
14 transaction with Paul Wertman, but I knew him and he knew me and
15 I knew him from almost the first day that I started practicing
16 here and every time I saw him he went out of his way to not just
17 say hello, but to get into a conversation. I think I first met
18 him at the Bar picnic right after I was admitted and he
19 introduced himself to me, but he didn't just introduce himself to
20 me we got into a conversation. We went for a walk. He wanted to
21 know about me, what I had done before I came back to Williamsport
22 and so forth and every time after that that I saw him wherever --
23 wherever it was, he would go out of his way to, again, not just
24 say hello; but to get into a conversation. He was a neat guy.
25 He really enjoyed friendships and he went out of his way to meet

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1 young lawyers when they were admitted to the Bar and to not just
2 meet them, but to learn about them. You know, it's a shame that
3 there aren't more people here because there is a lot to the learn
4 about the way Paul Wertman conducted his relationship with other
5 members of the Bar and we all could benefit by emulating him.
6 Thank you.

7 **PRESIDENT JUDGE BUTTS:** Thank you. Judge Kieser.

8 **RETIRED JUDGE WILLIAM KIESER:** Thank you. May it
9 please the Court, members of the Bar and others that are here.

10 You know, I can't top much more than what
11 Scott and Howard have said. I actually had more contact with
12 Willie outside the courthouse, outside of legal stuff crossing
13 paths with him in the community. We were both involved actively
14 in Lions' work. The other legal thing we had in common, I
15 believe I first met Willie in the Recorder's Office doing title
16 searches with those old big heavy dusty books and he was always a
17 handy source of referral to tell me, well, you got to go look
18 here and look there, whatever it is that you were doing. I mean
19 he knew that office -- well, of course, he knew Lois; but at the
20 same time he knew the ins and outs of that office as well as
21 anybody ever did.

22 I mean this as a sincere compliment to
23 Willie. To me Willie was the Happy of the Seven Dwarfs. I mean
24 talk about winsome, I mean, never saw him without a smile on his
25 face. Nothing has been mentioned about Willie's singing except a

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1 little reference to him enjoying the music up at his last church,
2 but I have a recollection that he sang in the church choir at the
3 Lutheran church and my sister is the musician in the family she
4 often dragged me to -- and she was a close friend of Lois, she
5 would often drag me to music events and Willie and Lois would
6 always be there and if you went to the Community Arts Center for
7 a musical-type thing you would cross paths with them, you go to
8 the ballpark you cross paths with him and wherever you saw him, I
9 mean, here's this jolly face just overrunning with joy. He lived
10 his Christian life by living a joyous life and he had a real joy
11 and he would tell you when you asked him the source of that joy
12 that was his Lord and they were just wonderful. He always wanted
13 to know about me, about the kids and everything and just, you
14 know, there is a lot of things you think you might do when you
15 enter the practice of law and things that you might mark your
16 accomplishments when it comes to a time like this, but I think
17 that this is one of the most significant achievements that a
18 person who is in the business of law could ask for is to be
19 regarded the way these Resolutions have presented him. So,
20 Mr. Willie Wertman, a real tribute to the Bar of Lycoming County.

21 **PRESIDENT JUDGE BUTTS:** Thank you. The Court will
22 accept and approve the Report and Resolution of the Committee and
23 I'll enter the following order:

24 And now this 23rd day of October, 2025, in
25 consideration of the Resolutions presented by the Committee

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1 appointed to draft Resolutions in the death of Paul "Will"
2 Wertman, Esquire, the said Resolutions are adopted and it is
3 ORDERED AND DIRECTED that the Resolutions herewith submitted and
4 attached be adopted as an official expression of the Lycoming
5 County Law Association and this Court and that the same be spread
6 upon the records of the Court and copies of this Resolution be
7 delivered to the family of Paul Wertman and it is further ORDERED
8 AND DIRECTED that said Resolution be entered at large upon the
9 record of the Court and that it be printed in the Lycoming
10 Reporter.

11 I'm going to direct my remarks now to my
12 colleagues.

13 I would note that Judge Gardner would have
14 loved to have been here, he had another conflict; but he did
15 prepare something. So I'll just take a moment to read it now.

16 I apologize for my inability to be present at
17 the memorial service. Unfortunately, I never had the occasion to
18 meet Attorney Wertman and after I read his obituary it's clear
19 that never meeting him is my loss. It appears that we both share
20 a passion for the Nittany Lion Wrestling Program and if he
21 attended any matches at either the Bryce Jordan Center or Rec
22 Hall over the last 10 years, I can confidently say that we were
23 at least in the same building at the same time.

24 It is further very clear that he adored his
25 family and cherished quality time with them. If the opportunity

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1 had presented I would have asked him to share some words of
2 wisdom regarding how to better balance the competing interest of
3 love for quality time with family and the obligations associated
4 with work. I continue to struggle in this area and always enjoy
5 hearing how my learned peers deal with this intricately woven
6 wrestling match between family and work. My sincere condolences
7 to the family for their loss. Judge Carlucci.

8 **JUDGE WILLIAM CARLUCCI:** Thank you, Judge Butts.
9 Attorney Wertman was an expert on estate planning and on real
10 estate and on organized sports and on sauerkraut and these are
11 things about which I know very little or nothing. I cannot,
12 therefore, add much to the thorough analysis performed by the
13 Committee. I will make this observation and for those of us who
14 did not have the privilege of knowing him, I'm deeply grateful to
15 the Committee for the energy you invested in bringing his life
16 alive for us and in addition to the fact that these proceedings
17 allow us to finally remember a member of our association. It
18 also gives those of us who didn't know the Counsel so well a
19 window into their life and I'm deeply grateful that the Committee
20 gave us that opportunity for Mr. Wertman and assuming that Judge
21 Gardner knows what he's talking about, it may be that Paul
22 understood worklife balance and assuming that to be true, that's
23 the fifth thing that he was an expert on that I know absolutely
24 nothing about. My thanks to the Committee.

25 **PRESIDENT JUDGE BUTTS:** Thank you. Judge Tira.

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1 **JUDGE RYAN TIRA:** Very similarly I want to express
2 my thanks and gratitude to the Committee because I did not have
3 the benefit of knowing Paul at all and I did not have an
4 opportunity to work with him, but I do feel now I have a better
5 sense of who this man was and what a hidden treasure he was to
6 our Law Association and the long time he spent supporting our
7 community and it's pleasure for me now to be able to know that
8 and I thank you again for taking the time to share that with us.

9 **PRESIDENT JUDGE BUTTS:** Judge Linhardt.

10 **JUDGE ERIC LINHARDT:** Thank you. I did not have
11 the pleasure of knowing Attorney Wertman, but I've so enjoyed
12 hearing you talk about him so thank you for sharing your stories.
13 It's clear to me that Paul Wertman was a man who was well loved,
14 which is not a small thing to say about a person, and it's
15 obvious he will be deeply missed by his friends and family. So
16 thank you.

17 **PRESIDENT JUDGE BUTTS:** In my experience one of
18 the most wonderful parts about this community is the ability to
19 have a day job and to be able to spend your time at a really --
20 at some different activities at nighttime, where you get to meet
21 different people in different circumstances and where I first met
22 Paul "Willie" was through Lois in the Register & Recorder's
23 Office. I spent a lot of time down there when I worked for Judge
24 Smith. I spent a lot of time down there with Mary Mosser and
25 when I was in the District Attorney's Office. So I had gotten

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1 first to know Lois, but then I would see Willie and Lois at the
2 Community Theater League because they would come to see shows and
3 he would always be very welcoming and friendly even though I was
4 in the District Attorney's Office and would never have crossed
5 paths with him. I would have known Lois from music club with
6 Judge Kieser's sister and spent time with them there, but really
7 the conversations we had were actually at the theater and his
8 love of community activities and his willingness to support all
9 of these wonderful performers and wonderful opportunities for the
10 community and that's, like I started out by saying, that's what I
11 love about this community where you can get to know somebody
12 fairly well and get to see their support of their family and we
13 talk about grandchildren and we talk about Lois and their
14 children and it was just a really nice opportunity to get to know
15 somebody without the law having been mentioned at all, that we
16 could be regular people and for that I appreciate the opportunity
17 to be a part of those activities. Also, I wonder what it would
18 have been like to work with him because I'm sure he was just as
19 thorough and as accomplished as an attorney as he was as a father
20 and a spouse and a grandfather and a member of the community
21 supporting very worthwhile activities. So, it's unfortunate that
22 we don't have any family here to be able to express that to them,
23 but once again, as all of my colleagues have said, it's
24 unfortunate that it's under these circumstances that we learn
25 about an exceptional contributing member of our Law Association

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1 who leaves us and is there a way to fill that gap? Probably not.
2 And that's very unfortunate.

3 So, would anyone else like to share some
4 memories or a few words about Willie? I know we have a couple of
5 Muncy lawyers in the room. I don't know if anybody wants to
6 share anything. Not putting any pressure on you. All right.
7 Mr. Smay.

8 **ATTORNEY JOHN SMAY:** I knew him from the time,
9 well, I guess, 42 years ago I met him and everything that was
10 said I can't add anything more to it because it's so true about
11 him. I would see him more often at football games at Muncy and
12 he would come in and we'd chat for a little bit and he'd talk
13 about his favorite, Penn State wrestling, and he would say oh,
14 I'm going to this place out of state to follow them, to watch
15 this wrestling match; but, yeah, and I knew Lois, I met her and I
16 probably talked, like you said, downstairs talked to her more
17 than I would see him; but he was always a happy gentleman, always
18 kind. If you had a question he would be more than willing to sit
19 down and talk to you. Yeah, I'll miss him because he was a nice
20 gentleman, very kind, very polite, and he was a good Christian
21 man. I knew him from and I do believe he was in the choir
22 because I remember, even though I didn't attend the Lutheran
23 Church, but I was there numerous times as a kid and I remember
24 him in that choir. So.

25 **PRESIDENT JUDGE BUTTS:** Tammy.

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1 **ATTORNEY TAMMY TAYLOR:** I remember Paul, as I knew
2 him, I didn't know him as Willie because when I first -- well, I
3 was born and raised in Williamsport; but in 1990 I graduated from
4 college and I didn't get into law school right away and Scott
5 Williams hired me to be a, I don't know, a legal assistant in the
6 office; but he thought it important that I learn how to title
7 search and so Patty Smay whisked me over to the Register and
8 Recorder's Office with the help of Deb Pietrovito and Dana Strunk
9 and a whole bunch of people that really knew how to title search,
10 I learned how to title search; but, of course, that's when I met
11 Lois and Lois was a help to me and whoever said about him dusting
12 off the big dusty books, I mean, that's how I also learned to
13 title search and Paul was there and I met Paul very early on and
14 he always did have a smile on his face. He, you know, greeted me
15 and was always available when I was over there trying to make
16 sure I did the right thing in a title to have him and Lois both
17 to help me out.

18 **PRESIDENT JUDGE BUTTS:** Thank you. Anyone else?
19 Mr. Greevy.

20 **ATTORNEY CHARLES GREEVY, III:** I knew Paul, I
21 think, even before I came back to practice because of our
22 association with a lot of the Bar at that point. I always found
23 him very comfortable. I can't remember ever having anything
24 directly with him as Ed mentioned also that he did, but I had
25 occasion to call him time and again a couple times, some title

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1 searching, sometime estate work; but I concur with what has been
2 said as far as his interest in sports. Gloria and I quite often
3 would be up at some of the ball games at Bowman Field and he and
4 Lois would be up there. I don't know if they ever missed a ball
5 game because it would seem that back in the many years in that
6 stage he and Lois were often there.

7 I enjoyed also a talk with him when I would
8 run into him casually any place, but he truly was a very
9 likeable, a wonderful and certainly very friendly gentleman to
10 know and always there to chat about something.

11 **PRESIDENT JUDGE BUTTS:** Thank you.

12 **ATTORNEY SCOTT A. WILLIAMS:** A good man.

13 **PRESIDENT JUDGE BUTTS:** Anyone else? Okay. Well,
14 ladies and gentlemen, this would now conclude our Memorial
