Judges and Lawyers “Go Back to School” in Lycoming County



According to a national poll conducted by the American Bar Association, less than half of the U.S. public knows that John Roberts is Chief Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court!

The poll found troubling gaps in knowledge of American history and government, as well as constitutional rights.

Ten percent of people think the Declaration of Independence freed slaves in the Confederate states, and almost 1 in 5 believe the first 10 amendments of the U.S. Constitution are called the Declaration of Independence instead of the Bill of Rights.

Judges and lawyers from the Lycoming Law Association are willing to educate students in grades K-12 about this year’s Law Day theme, what it’s like to be a lawyer/judge, and the Constitution!

This year's Law Day theme, "Voices of Democracy," recognizes that in democracies, the people rule. For nearly 250 years, Americans have expressed their political views and wishes by speaking their minds and voting in elections.
