ORDER

AND NOW, this \_\_\_ day of March 2003, the Court DENIES the Plaintiffs' Motion in Limine to Determine as a Matter of Law that the Physician Defendants in this case are the Agents of Defendant, Williamsport Hospital. First, the Plaintiffs have not pleaded facts in their complaint to support this theory of liability against the Hospital. The Plaintiffs did not allege that the Hospital was a participant in the federal Medicare/Medicaid program until they filed their Motion in Limine on March 5, 2003. Second, the motion is untimely and/or waived. The Court set a dispositive motion deadline of January 4, 2003 and a motion in limine deadline of February 19, 2003. Although the motion

is styled a motion in limine, it would more aptly be described as a motion for partial summary judgment. Moreover, the Hospital filed a motion for summary judgment on the issue of agency and the Plaintiffs did not raise this issue in response to the Hospital's motion. Lastly, and most importantly, the Medicare Act does not provide for a private right of action,<sup>1</sup> and the Court does not believe the regulations were intended for this type of situation.
