OPINION IN SUPPORT OF THE ORDER OF IN COMPLIANCE WITH RULE 1925(a) OF THE RULES OF APPELLATE PROCEDURE

Defendant Jeffery Howlett (hereafter "Howlett") has appealed from this court's order of August 11, 2008 in which Howlett's "Petition for Relief Under Article Six, Section Three of the Constitution of this Commonwealth" was denied and dismissed as untimely because it was filed more then one year after Howlett's judgment became final and Defendant failed to establish an exception to the one-year time limitation.

Howlett asserts that this Court's denial of said petition was an abuse of discretion. Specifically, Howlett alleges that 42 Pa.C.S.A. §9545, the Post Conviction Relief Act, has no jurisdiction over his petition. As such, Howlett asserts that this Court abused its discretion by not ruling on the merit of his claim that his right to counsel's assistance during the pre-trial stage of the proceedings was violated.

Howlett's appeal should be dismissed. For the purposes of the PCRA, judgment in the above captioned matter was final as of October 29, 1993, the date the Superior Court affirmed this Court's March 25, 1992 order which sentenced Howlett on his convictions on July 12, 1991 pursuant to a jury trial.

As Howlett exhausted his direct appeal rights, his sole means of raising additional

issues is through the PCRA. Because Howlett's judgment in this case was final as of October

29, 1993, however, this Court lacks jurisdiction to hear the Petition, unless Howlett pleads and

proves that one of the exceptions enumerated under the PCRA applies. It is precisely for this

reason that this Court could not address the issues raised in Howlett's "Petition for Relief

Under Article Six, Section Three of the Constitution of this Commonwealth." For a discussion

relating to Howlett's petition and lack of exceptions plead therein refer to this Court's August

11, 2008 order attached hereto.
