**OPINION IN COMPLIANCE WITH RULE 1925(a) OF THE  
RULES OF APPELLATE PROCEDURE**

Colin Best (“Appellant”) appeals this Court’s Order entered on August 4, 2022, in which the Supplemental Petition for Post-Conviction Relief Act filed by his court appointed counsel, Matthew Diemer, Esquire, was dismissed. Appellant’s Notice of Appeal was filed on August 19, 2022. On August 30, 2022, this Court directed Appellant to file a Concise Statement of Matters Complained of on Appeal within twenty-one (21) days. On September 14, 2022, Appellant’s counsel filed a Pa.R.A.P. 1924(c)(4) Notice of Intention to Withdraw in Lieu of a Concise Statement of Matters Complained of on Appeal. Appellant’s counsel indicated that he anticipates filing a brief pursuant to ***Anders v. California***, 386 U.S. 738 (1967).

This Court’s Opinion and Order docketed August 4, 2022, contained a detailed description of the procedural history as well a thorough analysis of the legal authority as it applied to the specific facts of the case. This Court concluded that Appellant failed to raise any meritorious issues in the Supplemental PCRA

Petition filed by Attorney Diemer, and therefore the Petition was dismissed. This Court will rely on its Order and Opinion docketed August 4, 2022, for purposes of this appeal. This Court respectfully requests that the Appellant's appeal be dismissed and this Court's Order dismissing the Supplemental PCRA Petition be affirmed.
