	<b><u>ORDER</u></b>	

**AND NOW**, this 14th day of March, 2022, having received Petitioner’s correspondence marked January 11, 2022, and February 3, 2022, which this Court will treat as his objection to the dismissal of his Post-Conviction Relief Act (PCRA) Petition, and which does not set forth any grounds to delay the disposal of this matter that were not addressed in the Order filed on December 17, 2021, Petitioner’s PCRA petition is hereby **DISMISSED**. Petitioner reiterates the timing of events leading up to his trial, but does not provide sufficient information that would demonstrate his eligibility for the requested relief or a PCRA evidentiary hearing. Petitioner cites to several cases in his petition, but does not allege how these cases qualify him for relief or demonstrate how they address the facts of his case that would show that the Commonwealth violated his right to a speedy trial. In fact, at least one of the cited cases held that the defendant’s right to a speedy trial was not violated. Commonwealth v. Hailey, 368 A.2d 1261, 1269 (Pa. 1977). Since Petitioner has not given the Court additional facts to supplement his argument and has only repeated the procedural history of his case, his petition is denied.

Petitioner is hereby notified that he has the right to appeal from this order to the Pennsylvania Superior Court. The appeal is initiated by the filing of a Notice of Appeal with the Clerk of Courts at the county courthouse, with notice to the trial judge, the court reporter and the prosecutor. The Notice of Appeal shall be in the form and contents as set forth in Rule 904 of the Rules of Appellate Procedure. The Notice of Appeal shall be filed within thirty (30) days after the entry of the order from which the appeal is taken. Pa. R.A.P. 903. If the Notice of Appeal is not filed in the Clerk of Courts' office within the thirty (30) day time period, Petitioner may lose forever his right to raise these issues.
