The judge who is designated to sign and schedule family law matters shall have the authority to assign any family law matter to a master as permitted by applicable law or rule of court. In referring a matter to a master, consideration shall be given to expediency, complexity, and other relevant considerations.

Any party may file exceptions to a master's report and/or recommendations as permitted by Pa.R.Civ.P. 1920.55-2 and Lycoming County local rule 1920.55.

As a matter of practice, contempt petitions where incarceration is a likely consequence, petitions for bifurcation, and petitions for advanced distribution will not be referred to masters.
