- ▶ **Commonwealth vs. Barnes (10/27/2025)**—Judge Nancy L. Butts
Criminal: Habeas corpus petition; prima facie case of false reports of child abuse where defendant, while involved in a child custody proceeding, repeatedly made claims of suspected child abuse by former spouse and paramour, and had the child tested for abuse and STDs, while at the same time in court denying concerns of abuse; evidence supporting the conclusion that defendant acted with the intent to manipulate or fabricate abuse narratives to implicate former spouse and paramour in a crime, rather than out of genuine concern for the child's wellbeing. - ▶ **Commonwealth vs. Davis (10/27/2025)**—Judge Nancy L. Butts
Criminal: Motion to preclude bad acts evidence; venue change due to pre-trial publicity; gag order applicable to district attorney's office providing cooling-off period; mere existence of pre-trial publicity as affecting venue decision; submitting supplemental questionnaire to potential jurors on pre-trial publicity; habeas corpus petition; sufficiency of evidence of accomplice liability or criminal conspiracy in murder case; proof of intent; totality of the circumstances and inferences supporting defendant's acting in concert in kidnapping, robbery and theft; motion to suppress statements made after request for lawyer, and after subsequent waiver of Miranda rights. Butts, President Judge of the 29th Judicial District of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, appointed the undersigned committee to prepare a Report and Resolutions memorializing the life of Paul “Will” Wertman, Esquire, for submission to the Court at a public ceremony to be held October 23, 2025. Accordingly, your committee submits the following Report and Resolutions:

1. Paul “Will” Wertman, a proud lifelong resident of eastern Lycoming County in Montgomery and Muncy, passed away peacefully on Wednesday, July 23, 2025.
2. Will was born on September 18, 1934, in Muncy, Pennsylvania, the son of the late William Clayton and Charlotte Emma “Lottie” (Forster) Wertman.
3. Will graduated from Muncy High School in 1952, from Penn State University in 1956 and from Dickinson School of Law in 1959.
4. Will served in the Army National Guard from 1959 to and including 1962.
5. Will married Lois Anne (Winder) Wertman on November 17, 1962 and they shared 57 years of marriage before her passing in 2019.
6. Will practiced law as a solo practitioner in Muncy for over 40 years, specializing in wills, estate law and real estate.
7. Will was particularly proud of his work helping seniors through the loss of a spouse and the legal challenges they experienced.
8. Will was an active member of the St. Andrew’s Lutheran Church of Muncy and for the last five years attended Mt.

- Pisgah Wesley Church in East Smithfield, PA, where he especially enjoyed singing old hymns and the fellowship of fellow believers.
9. Will was community-minded, volunteering for many organizations over the years, including his lifelong membership in the Montgomery Lions Club.
 10. Will was in charge of the Montgomery Lions Club Easter Egg Hunt for many years, sold gallons of sauerkraut and earned the high rank of the Melvin Jones Fellowship Award, which is the highest form of recognition for Lions Club International.
 11. He was a member of the West Branch Sports Hall of Fame Committee and was honored with the Volunteer of the Year Award in 2014.
 12. Will served on the boards of the Lutheran Evangelistic Movement East, the Muncy High School Sports Hall of Fame Committee, the Montgomery School Board and various church councils.
 13. Will was also a member of the Williamsport Scottish Rite.
 14. Sports was a huge part of Will's life. His competitive spirit was reflected when he competed, coached and cheered his favorite teams. Baseball was his first love, whether he was watching the Yankees with his father, coaching Little League and men's softball or supporting the Crosscutters. He could be frequently seen on the sidelines or in the bleachers of local sporting events.
 15. Will was a long time season ticket holder for the Penn State wrestling team and was a dedicated Penn State wrestling fan for over 70 years, having followed that team all over the country to matches and tournaments.
 16. Will was a winsome and friendly person, and had quality friendship and love for his family and friends.
 17. Will took time to foster relationships, which allowed him to make new friends throughout life as well as enjoying lifelong friendships.
 18. Will cherished his moments with daily coffee at the news stand, monthly luncheons with his friends from the Class of '52, as well as with his lawyer friends and other friends.

19. His greatest joys were moments with his family, especially his grandchildren.
20. He took time to have one-on-one relationships as Grandpa and with Lois as Grandma, both of whom were there to show love and support to their grandchildren.
21. In addition to his parents and wife, Will was predeceased by his brother Max in infancy and his cousins Marlin and VanDom Wertman Jr., who were like brothers to him.
22. Will was survived by two sons, William Wertman of Baltimore, Maryland, and Thomas Wertman of Muncy, Pennsylvania; two daughters and sons-in-law, Valerie and Fred Simpson and Vickie and Gary Ward, all of Troy, Pennsylvania; and eight grandchildren, Leah Ward, Emma Simpson, Trevor Ward, Connor Simpson, Braden Ward, Lou Wertman, Jackson Simpson and Lydia Ward.
